

A PARTIAL DISTANCE EDUCATION PROGRAM WITHIN THE MASTER OF FINANCIAL MATHEMATICS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA



The Master of Financial Mathematics (MFM) program, begun in 2007 teaches the mathematical tools of quantitative analysis in finance. Starting in the 2010-2011, four of our courses will be offered by distance, and will be available to distance students who are not enrolled in the MFM program. A student who takes these courses and then matriculates into MFM will have completed all but 24 of the credits needed for graduation, and can reasonably expect to complete the degree in one year.

For those wishing to take our distance courses non-degree, the application process is minimal. Those who do well in the distance courses and who, while taking those courses, complete an early application to the MFM program, can expect favorable treatment.
