**Problem 1.** (7 points) A body with mass  $m = 4$  kg is placed on a table and attached to the end of a spring on one side and a dashpot on the other side. The spring is stretched 2 meters by a force of 50 N and the dashpot provides  $c = 12$  N of resistance per each meter per second of velocity. The body is set in motion with initial position  $x(0) = 4$  m and initial velocity  $v(0) = 0$  m/s. Find the position function of the body as well as the amplitude and frequency.

**Problem 2.** (7 points) Find a particular solution of the equation

$$y'' - 4y' - 5y = 4e^{5x}.$$

**Problem 3.** (6 points) Consider the following matrix

$$A = \begin{bmatrix} 2+a & -3 \\ 1 & 1 \end{bmatrix}.$$

For what values of  $a$  does there exist a matrix  $P$  such that

$$P^{-1}AP = \begin{bmatrix} 2 & 0 \\ 0 & 4 \end{bmatrix}?$$

[Hint: What does the condition tell you about the eigenvalues of  $A$ ?]

**Problem 4.** (10 points) Find the particular real-valued solution of the system

$$\begin{aligned}x_1' &= -x_1 + 3x_2, \\x_2' &= -3x_1 - x_2\end{aligned}$$

with initial conditions

$$x_1(0) = 3, \quad x_2(0) = -1.$$

**Solution:** Find the eigenvalues of the matrix:

$$\begin{vmatrix} -1 - \lambda & 3 \\ -3 & -1 - \lambda \end{vmatrix} = \lambda^2 + 2\lambda + 10 = 0,$$

whence

$$\lambda = -1 \pm 3i.$$

Choose, say,  $\lambda = -1 + 3i$  and find an associated complex eigenvector:

$$\mathbf{v} = (-i, 1).$$

A complex-valued solution will then be

$$e^{-t}(\cos 3t + i \sin 3t) \begin{bmatrix} -i \\ 1 \end{bmatrix}.$$

Its real and imaginary parts produce two linearly independent real-valued solutions

$$\mathbf{x}_1(t) = e^{-t} \begin{bmatrix} \sin 3t \\ \cos 3t \end{bmatrix} \quad \text{and} \quad \mathbf{x}_2(t) = e^{-t} \begin{bmatrix} -\cos 3t \\ \sin 3t \end{bmatrix}.$$

A linear combination of them will be a vector-function whose components are

$$\begin{aligned}x_1 &= e^{-t}(c_1 \sin 3t - c_2 \cos 3t), \\x_2 &= e^{-t}(c_1 \cos 3t + c_2 \sin 3t).\end{aligned}$$

Substituting the initial conditions, we get  $c_1 = -1$  and  $c_2 = -3$ . Thus,

$$\begin{aligned}x_1 &= e^{-t}(-\sin 3t + 3 \cos 3t), \\x_2 &= -e^{-t}(\cos 3t + 3 \sin 3t).\end{aligned}$$

**Problem 5.** (10 points) Find a general real-valued solution of the system  $\mathbf{x}' = \mathbf{A}\mathbf{x}$  for

$$\mathbf{A} = \begin{bmatrix} 5 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 2 & 3 \\ 0 & 0 & 2 \end{bmatrix}.$$

**Answer:**

$$c_1 e^{5t} (1, 0, 0) + c_2 e^{2t} (0, 3, 0) + c_3 e^{2t} (0, 3t, 1).$$
